

## High Firs Primary School- PE Premium Spending 2016/17

Since 2013, the Government has provided £150 million a year for Primary Schools sports. Money goes directly to Primary Schools, to spend on further enhancing their PE provision.

The contribution of PE and active learning to the health and well-being of our children has always been highly valued. We believe that the important skills of teamwork, collaboration, co-operation and perseverance, which are an integral part of the teaching and learning of PE, can have a positive impact on the attitudes and learning behaviours of the children in other curriculum areas too.

We aim for all children to benefit from our PE provision, regardless of sporting ability. Many of our children are given opportunities to represent our school teams in a variety of sports and enjoy competing against other local schools. We also focus on staff having training and development opportunities, which allows them to develop their own teaching for future years too.

### **High Firs received £8,900 for 2016/17. This was spent on:**

### **Outcomes from spending in 2016/17 are judged as being successful because**

- Hiring specialist PE teachers to work with our own teachers during PE lessons has provided high quality teaching for our children and training for our staff to ensure that this continues in the future.
- After school clubs offered opportunities for children to participate in sporting activities not previously offered and for identified groups of children; all clubs have been oversubscribed and have had positive outcomes, including high participation rates in Athletics, Girls Football, Cheerleading and Street Dance
- 35% increase in membership of sports clubs within the school
- 3 new clubs introduced for Key Stage 1; 2 new clubs introduced for years 3 &4; number of sports clubs offered increased by 50%
- 72% of Key Stage 2 children took part in school sports clubs during school year 2016/17, which is an increase of 10% on the previous year.
- All Key Stage 2 children took part in 3 Intra-school House sports tournaments
