## SUPPORTING LEARNING AT HOME

We appreciate the support that you give your child at home. **Learning Logs** are designed to support in-class learning and to be accessed by all the children at their own level, so everyone is expected to "do their best" each week; children may be asked to complete Home Learning during their own time in school if it is not returned appropriately completed. You will know what is realistic for your child in terms of output and time taken to undertake the tasks and the amount of support you give may vary week to week; please let us know if you have any concerns regarding this. Learning Logs are explained each week before going home but if your child is still unsure please ask them to ask a member of class staff *before* the handing-in day! **Spellings** are sent home weekly and may focus on the recommended word list (see below), children's individual needs and topic-related words. Again, words are appropriate for the children they are assigned to and children are expected to attain a minimum score in the tests. **Times Tables** are essential to support your children's maths lessons in Year 4 so all practise is a good thing!
